Congratulations and thank you mandi huizinga! During her ordination on Sept 17th, mandi will be dedicating all fundraising efforts to the UUWF Majorie Bowens-Wealthy scholarship fund. rev. mandi huizenga currently serves as the settled minister of DuPage Unitarian Universalist Church.

In a brief interview mandi stated that she chose the MBW fund to "amplify the importance of providing opportunities for women of color to enter ministry and fulfill their call". mandi, who does not capitalize their name as a practice to honor the interconnected web of all creation, describes her calling to ministry work came from the heart-breaking stories she heard during the UUA's Commission on Institutional Change's work. mandi says, "my work is about creating healthy congregations who reflect anti-racism, anti-oppression values and living in both their structures and in their hearts.

"The MBW fund is one way to prioritize more equitable opportunities for entering ministry", she says. For mandi, "the faith we wish to become is the faith we need to live into today. Providing equitable opportunities for all to follow their call to ministry is one way to ensure that our faith in the future truly matches our values and becomes how we wish to inspire. The Unitarian Universalism tradition I wish to be a part of honors all calls to ministry and removes as many barriers to that process as possible. The MBW scholarship provides such an opportunity, one small way to live my faith in action".
